What Challenges Your Humility?

Dear Parishioners:

Happy Labor Day weekend – the unofficial end of summer vacation. The school bells have already rung to signal the beginning of another school year. It's another wonderful season to be at St. Ignatius Parish.

Do you like to face what is true about yourself even when it is a difficult truth? It's not my favorite thing. But such moments can be a source of delicious irony and humor. For example, a teacher asked the class, "In the parable of the Good Samaritan, why didn't the priest go over and help the man in the ditch?" A little girl answered, "Because he saw that the man had already been robbed"

The theme of this weekend's readings is *humility*. The first reading from Sirach recommends that the greater you are, the more humble you are. In the gospel, Jesus proposes a *new* type of humility -- a humility based on respect for each person's dignity.

Of course, this is an amazing teaching. For Jesus, everyone is special. He counsels his friends to treat everyone with respect, kindness and compassion. He says that everyone deserves a place of honor at the wedding party. For Jesus, your worth derives not from your accomplishments but from your status as God's child. Treat others with respect if for no other reason than that they belong to an attentive Father.

Think back through the gospels, and consider how Jesus deals with the question of social privilege. He dismisses a mother's request that her sons will sit in places of honor at his right and left in the banquet of heaven.

He shocks the righteous people of his time by making friends with tax collectors, Samaritans, and prostitutes. He astonished his followers when he washed their feet. For Jesus, humility

means treating everyone with respect.

The problem with humility is that it can be confused with weakness. If humility means treating others with respect, then humility is easy when people respect one another. Humility becomes difficult when people behave badly toward you -- when they show no respect for you. It is then that humility -- treating others with respect -- can seem like weakness.

The second reading today from Hebrews is so consoling. What do you want from church today? Did you come to witness splendid displays of divine power -- a blazing fire, a gloomy darkness, a wild tempest, a trumpet blast, a scary voice uttering a threatening message? In other words, did you come to church today to hear all the usual Old Testament warnings about your misguided pride and how you need to change? Or did you come to church today to seek a new experience of divine compassion?

The point of today's reflection about humility is for encouragement. Of course you and I want to respect others. Of course we want to honor everyone else on the planet. Of course we want respect, and react with stung pride when others hurt our feelings. That's why we've come to church today. So that Jesus can animate us with his spirit -- so Christ can purify us with the blood of the new covenant --so God can replace our hearts of vengeance with hearts of forgiveness.

Accepting the call of Jesus to be humble is difficult in a world that defines the worth of a person by money or celebrity or a good reputation. But Jesus guarantees our worth when he stands with us in our humiliations.
